## MONTHLY REPORT FOR JUNE 2014

### COMMENTS:

For the month of JUNE the Rivers police Service responded to 49 various calls for Service, and continued with the “USE Your Head” campaign for the use of bicycle helmets. I attended the Rivers Elementary school and we drew the prize for the bike and the winner was Nolan PERREAULT.

I also attended the Rivers Collegiate for the grand opening of the GSA Room, as well as I participated in the Mock disaster, which involved all facets of emergency services, Jim DUTHIE put a tremendous effort into setting this up for the students. The scene depicted a person that had been texting and driving and then was involved in a collision, where there were multiple victims.

June was the kickoff to the Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation Road Watch program.( CN Police/Cornwallis also participated )There were in total three separate Road watches conducted, which resulted have resulted in 18 Common offence notices being issued. The Motor Carrier Enforcement personal were with us for two of the three check stops, which resulted in a total of 28 separate vehicle inspections ( primarily trucks and trailers ), of these 11 pass inspection, and 17 failed and were found in violation of various offences from Insecure load, to lighting issue, to improper class of license and improperly register vehicles.

There were two calls for assistance for the RCMP where the Rivers Police Service assisted; one was at CHIMO beach which involved a possible impaired driver, and the other involved a suspicious male walking very funny two miles north of Rivers. ( time spent one hour between the two calls )
