COMMENTS: The Month of November saw the Rivers Police Service host a Town Hall meeting. There will be an official report forth coming. From this report a strategic plan will be implemented. Traffic enforcement was one of the topics brought up during the Town Hall, and the intersection at 2nd and Colombia Shelly Mom's, where vehicles are parking to close to the curb, making it difficult to see when travelling north . Crossing the double solid line when parking down town was a repeated topic of discussion. I have instructed our members to start with an education component where they will be issuing warnings for the first month or so, and then we will start an enforcement component. Community talks through the elementary school and high schools were also requested, and as this council is aware I am a big advocate of this, and will continue to be involved in this area.

I attended to the Rivers Kids club and delivered a talk to two classes, to the three year olds and the four year olds.

There were another two arrests with regards to the vandalism to the Rivers Collegiate that concludes this file; the three co accused will appear in Court December 1st.

A file of interest is one where the Rivers Police Service was called to the VIA rail station and asked to remove to unruly passengers from the rail car, two adults one from Kenora Ontario , and a second male from Quebec were arrested and lodged at Brandon Correctional center for Breach of the Peace.
