

**RIVERDALE MUNICIPALITY
BY-LAW NO. 2019-01**

**BEING A BY-LAW OF RIVERDALE MUNICIPALITY FOR THE
PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A POLICE BOARD**

WHEREAS Section 26(1) of *The Police Services Act, C.C.S.M., Cap. P94.5*, provides as follows:

26(1) Every municipality that operates a police service must establish and maintain a police board in accordance with this Division.”

AND WHEREAS Section 30(1) of The Police Services Act provides in part as follows:

30 (1) The Council of a municipality must establish the size of its police board by by-law. The police board must

a) consist of at least three members, in the case of a municipality with a population under 5,000

NOW THEREFORE RIVERDALE MUNICIPALITY, in Council assembled, enacts as a by-law as follows:

1. A Police Board for Riverdale Municipality is hereby established.
2. The Board shall consist of five (5) members.
3. The members shall be appointed as follows:
 - a. No More than Two (2) members of Council or an employee of the Municipality appointed by resolution of council;
 - b. At Least Two (2) residents appointed by resolution of council, who are neither members of council nor employees of Riverdale Municipality
 - c. One (1) member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council.
4. Council shall appoint the chair and vice-chair of the police board by resolution of council.
5. Remuneration to members of the police board who are not members of council or employees of the municipality shall be set by resolution of council.
6. That By-law No. 08-2012 is hereby repealed
